Our Mission

Our Mission at Exeter-West Greenwich High School is to graduate young adults with the knowledge, skills, and abilities needed to achieve their goals and become responsible members of their communities.

Key Features at EWGRHS

- All students must complete a Capstone Senior Project.
- All students must complete a minimum of 10 hours of community service as a requirement to graduate.
- Over 85% of the EWG population enroll in college prep, Honors, Dual Enrollment and/or AP courses.
- About 85% of EWG graduates attend a post secondary placement.
- EWG offers a rigorous college prep curriculum with a variety of opportunities for students to challenge themselves with AP, Honors and Dual Enrollment courses.

OUR COMMUNITY

Exeter-West Greenwich Regional High School is a public high school, established in 1990. It is a Junior-Senior High School complex located on 40 wooded acres in West Greenwich, RI. The first class graduated in 1992. The current student population at the high school is 460 students. The New England Association of Schools and Colleges continued accreditation for EWGHS in 2018.

EWG students focus on deeper learning skills, and are assessed and show mastery of these skills. They do this through classes that are project-based and where subjects are integrated together. At New Tech, it's "real world projects and real world learning." At EWG every student receives a device and are provided the necessary tools to complete their projects. Students have access to Xello and ASPEN, collaborative learning management systems that house the school's curriculum, standards, assessment, and reporting tools.

Since the 2002- 2003 school year the high school has been in a semester 4x4 block schedule with an A/B modification for .50 credit courses. With this design, students are able to achieve 8.0 credits per year and 32 credits overall in a 4-year time frame, of which 24 credits are required to graduate EWGHS
